At the National CND Rally in London on October 26th., E.P. Thompson exhorted us to "feel our strength". Exeter CND did not then exist. Now,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  months later, we have over 700 members, many of them talented and influential people, and for us his words have aquired a new relevance.

We have been through the tedious and time-consuming task of setting up the Group and now have a thorough and enabling constitution and six elected Officers. We have a healthy bank balance, much of which is already earmarked for various new projects. Our leaflet "Nuclear War and You" has been commented upon, very favourably, at a National CND Council Meeting, and is being adapted for their use by a large number of other Groups throughout the Country.

Many of our newer members, particularly those who for one reason or another have been unable to attend their Area Group Meetings, might well be feeling still rather uninvolved and uninformed. Please bear with us. The administrative task of setting up a Group of this size has been enormous, and much of the "fine detail" may well have been everlooked. Please take the initiative — if you have offered help that has been ignored, or made a request that has not yet been answered, try again now that the organisation is (we hope) running more smoothly. As you will see, there are jobs for everyone, at whatever level of involvement best suits them and their circumstances.

Working Group A (responsible for the production of literature and propaganda) will shortly be producing some Information Fact Sheets for members. The first of these will include details of the way in which Exeter CND has been organised, which should help clarify certain issues for new members.

A lot of positive decisions were nade at the last Council Meeting on Monday February 9th. The Minutes of this Meeting have been distributed to co-ordinators for the next Area Group Meetings, and can be seen on request to your co-ordinator. However, it would be useful to bring to your notice certain points that involve the co-operation of all members.

#### 1. Easter Peace March

There will be a March through the centre of Plymouth on Easter Saturday (April 18th) to a Rally (on the Hoo, if Plymouth Council will decide to allow it, Central Park if not). The Rally will be addressed by Lords Philip Noel Baker and Fenner Brockway, a local Church Leader and possibly Liz Signund. There will be a short silent vigil for peace and a variety of musical entertainments.

We are hoping to fill 20 coaches - 15 are already booked - as we would like the Exeter and district turn out to be really impressive. Tickets will be available soon, at £1.40 and 70p for OAP's, students etc. If for any reason you are unable to come, could you sell a ticket to a sympathiser to come in your stead. If you can come, bring your friends and family. It will be the first time for years that such a domonstration has taken place in the S.W., and it is important to make it as large and as newsworthy as possible.

N.B. Voluntoers are needed for stewarding the March.

### 2. The Shop

The Pennsylvania Group have been running a CND Shop at 4, New Bridge Street (bottom of Fore St.). This has been an extremely useful and successful enterprise, and, at their request, it is now becoming the general responsibility of Exeter CND. The shop helps pay its way by also solling bric-a-brac, books, records etc (not clothes), so if you have anything to denate or sell on a profit-sharing basis it would be very helpful.
